**PROGRAM** – Rick Speck presented a program on the BRICKS OF KANSAS.



Ellinwood's Underground Tunnels allow visitors to walk some of the original passageways while tour guides share early prohibition and entrepreneurship stories in the area. You will see antique relics of the past found deep within the tunnels. The town's early residents used the tunnels for refuge during WWI, to possibly bootleg alcohol during Prohibition, and to support cowboys and families traveling through the area by providing services to them. In today's vernacular, the Ellinwood Tunnels are the ultimate "man cave".

In 1894 John Wolf built The Wolf Hotel as an addition to the Delmonico Hotel which stood just north of the building which is now the Sunflower Bank parking lot. The addition added several rooms to the Hotel along with a new lobby, underground stores and the Bank of Ellinwood. The Bank was the last to open due to intricate tile work being laid. The lobby sat on the east side of the building and the bank sat on the west. Downstairs, which was part of the underground tunnel system that ran through Ellinwood, was the Drummer's room and Joe's Snack Counter. The downstairs changed many times over the years, becoming Weber's Sample Room, the local library, a gym, and an underground bar and card room. The downstairs still houses the very first air conditioner in Barton County. The Sunflower dining room, added in 1924 by Fred Wolf (John Wolf's son) was a prestigious restaurant that attracted people from many places with its amber lighting and wheat shock columns. In the early 80s, the hotel functioned as an antique store and was sold to Christopher McCord in 2013 with the vision of returning it to its former glory.


## **TECH ARTICLE**

### FAN BELT

Did you know that Model A fan belts are now being sold in different lengths? Yes, some are so short you cannot even pry them onto the pulleys with a pinch bar; and others are so long, that when you adjust them the belt will rub a hole in your lower radiator hose.

Even the Gates #700 should be checked for proper length.

When adjusting the tension of your fan belt, tighten it only enough that it will not slip



on the pulleys. If your generator is charging 10 amps, your belt is tight enough.


A belt that is too tight will wear out or frazzle prematurely, and furthermore will damage generator and water pump bearings.

## Lingerie and Undergarments

In contrast, the men's undergarments were essentially the same as in previous years. Men in all walks of life wore short and long union suits, also known as "Long Johns". For the man who wanted a cooler undergarment, lightweight cotton sleeveless union suits were made. Boxer briefs and undershirts were available and look much like today's underwear. The fabrics used were wool, silk, rayon, cotton, and blends that usually included cotton. The styling elements for teens resembled the same design as adult fashion. Children's underwear and lounging attire was styled much like the adults, with styling changes made for the very young.
