Bus Trip to Michigan



Bus Trip to Indiana & Michigan to visit 5 different museums September 19-23, 2024

Estimated cost per person \$1,099.75 single room and \$788.75 for double occupancy

History is the study of change over time. The introduction of the automobile to America dynamically altered life for all of us and sewed the seeds of change. For most of us, our parents and/or grand-parents were the first Americans to own a car. No longer restricted to the small farms, rural communities or large cities, the auto provided a means to travel great distances in a short period and forever changed their lives and our lives as the future generation.

The proposed bus trip to Michigan will provide us with the opportunity to look back at the early years of the automobile and reflect on our parents and grand-parents lives. It will provide all of us with the opportunity to ponder how much different would our life be today without automobiles.

On our bus trip we will be stopping at five different museums. Each stop will offer a unique view into our country's past. The first stop will be the Studebaker National Museum. Housed in a 55,000 square-foot facility the facility houses several objects designated as "National Treasures" including the carriage Abraham Lincoln rode to Ford's Theatre the night of his assassination as well as carriages used by Ulysses S. Grant, William McKinley and Benjamin Harrison. Adjacent to the Studebaker museum is the History Museum & Oliver Mansion. Completed in 1897, the mansion was built by industrialist J.D. Oliver (Oliver chilled plow fame). The 38-room Queen Anne Romanesque house and furnishings provide visitors with a remarkable look-back in time as the house and majority of furnishings are all original.

Telling the History of America through the Automobile is a core value of the Gilmore Museum. As our third stop on our bus adventure, The Gilmore is hailed as one of the top museums in the nation. The idea for the museum came from Donald Gilmore's wife Genevieve Gilmore. Located on 90 acres of land in southwestern Michigan in a small town known as Hickory Corners, the museum has over 190,000 square feet of exhibit space. The grounds feature numerous vintage structures including a restored and fully-functioning 1941 Silk City Diner (where we will plan to have lunch).

Our fourth, fifth and final stop of our bus trip will take us to Auburn, Indiana where we will visit The Early Ford V-8 Museum and Auburn Duesenberg Cord Museum. The Early Ford V-8 Museum focus is on products manufactured by Ford between 1932 and 1953. This is a museum that I hope to personally "click" with. Growing up in Albuquerque, New Mexico in the 1950's my mom, aunt and uncle shared a 1952 or 53 Ford (I was too young to distinguish the differences and no one is around to tell me). Although very young, I can still remember the pea-green Ford parked in-front of the shared house (note: everything was shared as no one had much money).

Our last stop will be at the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum. Housed in the original Auburn Automobile Company showroom and company offices, the museum exhibits over 120 cars on three levels. Although priced out of the range for most people, the cars exhibited reveal the incredible technology for that period of time.

Hopefully you have been inspired by this short synopsis of our pending Indiana/Michigan bus trip. We have 16 seats remaining (as of February 4, 2024). We will have to turn in a final head count April 1, 2024 and will require a trip deposit at that time. MAFFI MINUTE

The Gilmore Auto Museum, the site of the Model A Museum, is open year around and at this time of year the museum has Sunday afternoon lectures at 2p.m. The website has a complete listing, but one that I found enticing is on February 4, "How to Buy and Sell Collector Cars".

However, if a trip to Hickory Corners, Michigan isn't in your January/February travel plans, you can still indulge in Model A hobby fun by visiting or re-visiting the maffi.org website. The website has 4 live streaming cameras to view the museum from your armchair. And, if you click the Media button, you can hear the audio recordings of original records developed in the Model A Era for salesmen's use in training and customer sales. They're fun to listen to!

If you're more of a visual person, there's a MAFFI You Tube site, also accessible from the website as well as Paul Shinn, the Model A Guy's You Tube site, accessible from the website.

And let's not forget the upcoming Valentine's Day. You do have a Model A that is your sweetheart don't you? Why not honor her (or him) with her/his picture at the Model A museum next to your name by getting involved in the "My A" program. It features a plaque mounted on a museum wall segregated by year (1928, 1929, 1930, 1931) showing your vehicle, your name, your home area, and your vehicle body style. Details can be found under "expansion" on the maffi.org website.

And, as a bit of fun trivia let me leave you with this tidbit. One hundred and ten years ago, on Jan. 5, 1914, Henry Ford implemented a \$5 per day wage for his workers. But, workers soon found out they wouldn't immediately get the \$5 per day. Workers still made \$2.30 and were given a \$2.70 bonus if they followed all of the company's requirements. Here's how workers would be eligible:

- abstain from alcohol
- not physically abusive toward their families
- not take in boarders
- keep homes clean

TECH ARTICLE

Jim's Tech Tips "Ignition Misfires"

We've all experienced it. When the engine is cold and first started up, the engine is running rough and you can tell not all 4 cylinders are firing. It usually clears up in under a minute. But later, when the engine is warm, you should not feel a miss when climbing a hill or accelerating into traffic. If the power is just not there, like you know it should be, where to look? It could be a carburetor problem, but don't overlook fouled spark plugs and problems in the distributor.

Check the point gap in the distributor. The cam follower wears as you drive and the point gap closes down, giving a weak spark. So check it and increase the gap back to 0.020" if needed. While you are there, look for burned points and clean them up or replace them; you might have a bad or weak condenser.

Look at the rotor. Make sure the black flat spring is touching the underside of the cap, and is not burned up. Wipe off any oil film on the rotor.

Look at the underside of the distributor cap. Inspect the graphite button on the underside. I have seen caps with the entire button broken off and missing.


Look at the inside of the distributor body (the black plastic piece). Look for an oil and dirt film on the inside. Wipe it out with a clean cloth. Look for "carbon tracks" on the inside of the cap, where the spark is jumping down to ground on the metal housing. (See photo.) Replace if needed.
